Prof. Paul B. S. Lai was elected as the President of the College of Surgeons of Hong Kong in September 2016. He has previously served in the College Council as Councilor, Vice-President, Censor-in-Chief and Chief Editor of Surgical Practice (the official journal of CSHK). Apart from being a surgical trainer, he has been organizing college examinations and serving as examiners at the membership examination and exit examination in general surgery.

Prof. Lai graduated from the Chinese University of Hong Kong and received his surgical training in Hong Kong and Edinburgh. After completion of surgical training, he has been working as an academic surgeon at the Prince of Wales Hospital, the teaching hospital of the Chinese University of Hong Kong. Prof. Lai is currently the Chief of Service at the Department of Surgery, Prince of Wales Hospital and the Cluster Coordinator for Surgical Services at the New Territories East Cluster of the Hospital Authority (HA). He is also the Director of Surgical Outcome Monitoring and Improvement Program (SOMIP) at the HA, a clinical audit program studying the surgical outcome of all HA hospitals.

On the academic side, Prof. Lai is the Division Chief of Hepatobiliary and Pancreatic Surgery and Director of the Office of Medical Education at the Faculty of Medicine, the Chinese University of Hong Kong. His major research areas include basic research on hepatocellular carcinoma, clinical research in hepato-biliary and pancreatic surgery, enhanced recovery after surgery and surgical outcome research.

Prof. Jizong ZHAO is an Academician of Chinese Academy of Sciences. He is also a M.D, Professor and the Chairman of Neurosurgery Department, Beijing Tiantan Hospital. His specialty includes clinical research and work of brain tumors, cerebral vascular diseases, head trauma and minimal invasive neurosurgery and scientific research project of Chinese Government about the stroke, brain tumors and minimally invasive neurosurgery. Professor ZHAO received micro-neurosurgery training in Harry Ford Hospital in Detroit from 1990 to 1991 and in Department of Neurosurgery. UT, Houston. TX, USA, from 1989 to 1990.

Prof. ZHAO has published over 300 articles in China and abroad. He has been the president of Chinese Neurosurgical Society since 2004, international membership with the AANS, Marshal of World Federation of Neurosurgical Societies (WFNS), the president of Beijing Neurosurgical Society and the president of Beijing Neurosurgeons Society. He has also been the deputy chief-editor of National Medical Journal in China, editor of Surgical Neurology and Neurosurgery in USA and Neurosurgical Review in Germany. He is the chief editor of Neurosurgery, Brain Tumor Surgery and Minimal Invasive Neurosurgery.

Prof. Ian ORMISTON is an Oral and Maxillo Facial Surgeon trained in Medicine Dentistry and Surgery. He is a Consultant Oral and Maxillofacial Cleft Surgeon at the University Hospitals of Leicester where he is currently Head of Service. He has recently been appointed as a King James IV Professor to the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh, based on his published work and clinical surgery around orthognathic facial surgery for obstructive sleep apnoea (OSA).

He has over 25 years of experience in this field, an interest that was sparked whilst a lecturer in the University of Hong Kong in the 1990's.

Prof. ORMISTON is a Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh examiner both in the UK and overseas. He currently sits on the Board of the British Society of Dental Sleep Medicine and on the Committee of the Royal Society of Medicine RSM (Sleep Section). While remaining as a Hong Kong resident, he lectures and travels widely, particularly in Asia.

HONG KONG INFORMATION

Climate

Average temperature in September is around 26°C - 30°C.

Airport Departure Tax

Passengers flying out of Hong Kong International Airport (HKIA) are liable for a departure tax of HK\$120 per person (aged 12 and above), the tax is collected together with the airfare.

Exemptions given to passengers who:

- Arrive and depart from Hong Kong within the same day; or
- Arrive at HKIA by ferry from a port in the Pearl River Delta, with an application for a pre-paid Hong Kong Airport Departure Tax Refund (APDT) when checking-in upstream.

There is also a security charge of HK\$45 to maintain the standards of safety, security and passenger services currently required at international airports, and from 1 August 2016 onwards, an Airport Construction Fee ranging from \$70 to \$180. All of these surcharges are normally included in the price of the airline ticket.

Language

English is the language of international business, while Cantonese is the territory's local language. Street signs, menus, tourist and government publications are bilingual.

Currency, office and bank hours

Hong Kong's unit of currency is the Hong Kong dollar (HKD) which is currently pegged to the US dollar (USD) at a rate about HKD7.8=USD1 in which this exchange rate may fluctuate slightly. Most foreign currencies are easily changed at any authorized money exchangers and traveller's cheques are accepted by most leading banks and hotels. Credit cards are widely accepted at major hotels, large restaurants, department stores and shops. Banks open from 0900 to 1630 weekdays, 0900 to 1230 on Saturdays. Automated Teller Machines (ATMs) are widespread and available 24 hours. Offices generally open from 0900 to 1700, Mondays to Fridays. Many of them are now closed on Saturdays due to the implementation of the five-day work week.

Telecommunication

Hong Kong has a well-developed telecommunications infrastructure which provides easy access to a variety of international telecommunications network services. Electronic mail and database access services are widely used. International direct dial (IDD) and facsimile services cover most countries.

Wi-Fi

There is an extensive coverage of Wi-Fi network across the city. Free Wi-Fi services are available in many locations such as major tourist attractions, shopping malls, museums and government buildings.

Transportation

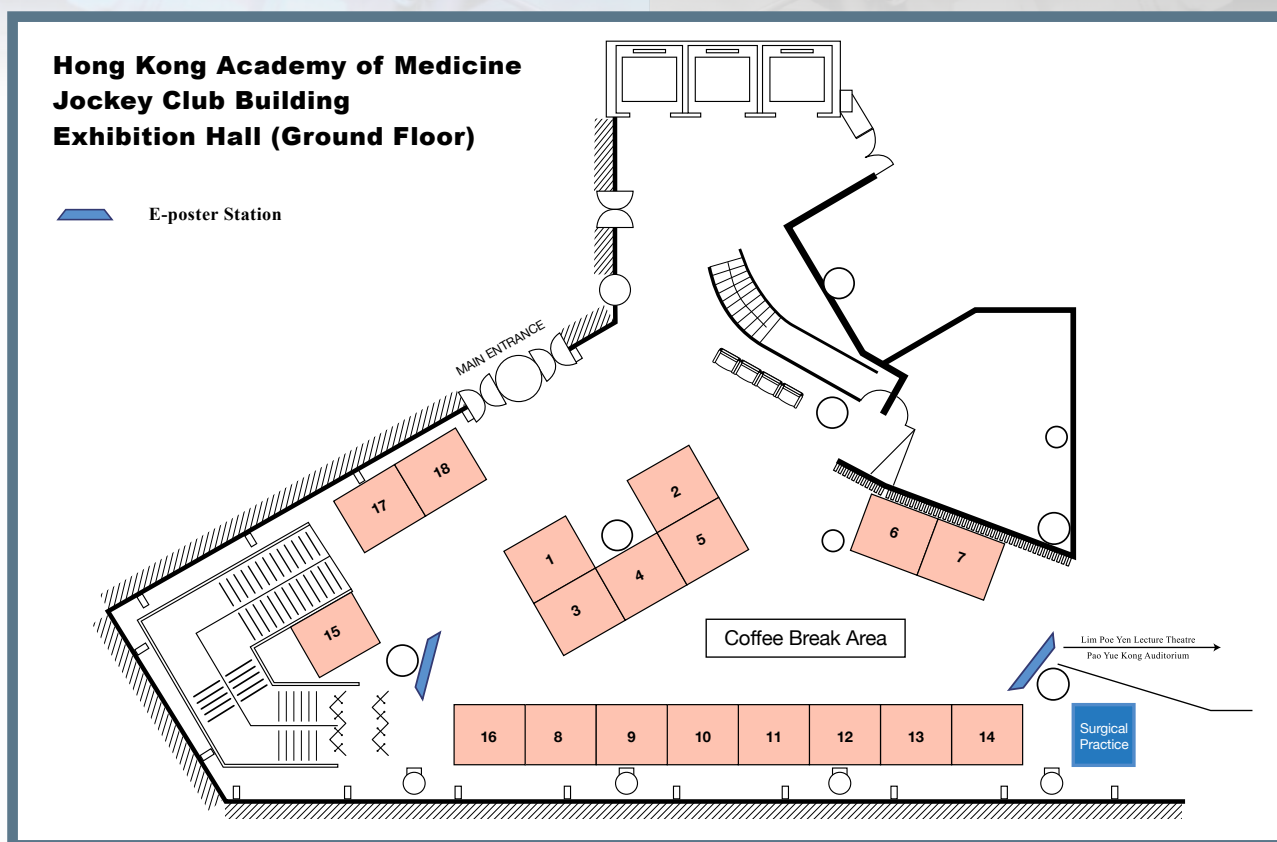
Getting around is easy in Hong Kong, thanks to an inexpensive, efficient public transport system. Networks of double decker buses and taxis operate territory-wide. The Mass Transit Railway (MTR) offers both the fast, modern and air-conditioned transport underground transport services on Hong Kong Island and Kowloon and the aboveground transport services in the New Territories. And for those looking for a mode of travel that has been used for decades, there are the street trams on the Hong Kong Island.

As a quick fix to your destination, Hong Kong's taxis can be an efficient and bargain option.

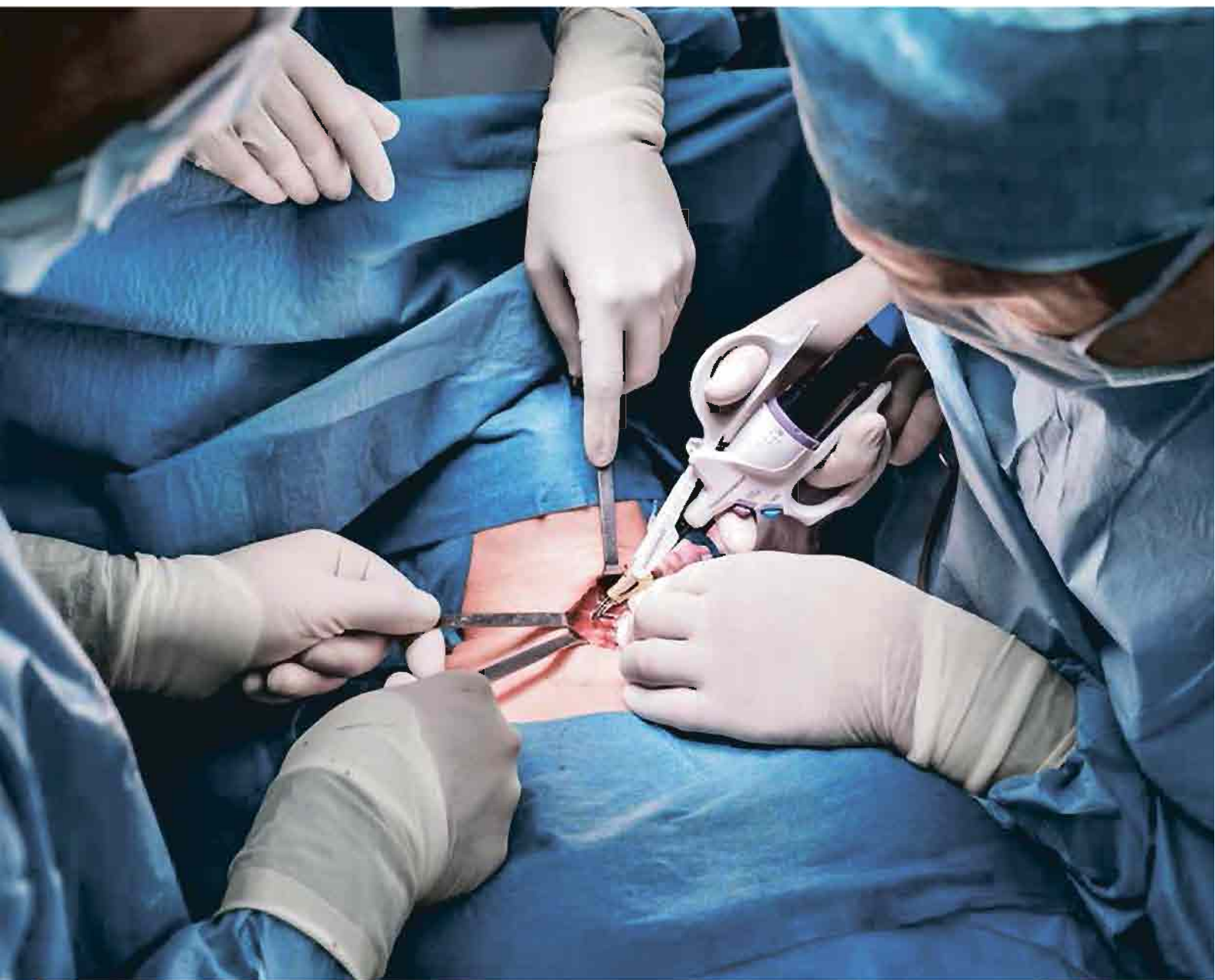
